The entries were judged by members of TWYGS and prizes will be awarded at assembly on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> July.

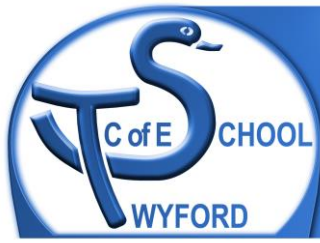
