FOTS Updates

I would like to say a huge thanks to the FOTS committee and volunteers for the activities and fundraising events they have organised over the past year. The Summer Sizzler last week was a huge success and I was pleased that it did not have to be renamed 'The Summer Drizzler'! Thank you to everyone who came along or purchased raffle tickets to support the event; it was a great opportunity for everyone to come together and be part of the Twyford School community.

FOTS have achieved so much this year: arranging a film night, a disco, Christmas party boxes and the Chinese New Year Dragon dance workshop to name a few. Because of these events, they have been able to help fund transport for school trips (making each trip at least £10 cheaper), contribute towards the cost of whole class music lessons by XYZ Music, gift Year 6 with leavers hoodies, ice-pop treats for children at lunchtimes and purchase books.

On Monday this week, the AGM was held where a review of the year took place and also committee members were decided for the forthcoming year. During this meeting the chair, Amilie Zhang, and co-chair, Gina Harding, stood down from their positions, leaving these roles vacant. The role of secretary is also vacant. Sadly, without these positions being filled there will no longer be a functioning PTA, meaning activities organised for the children and support given to the school will cease.

Reading and Library Books

Many thanks to everyone for sending any borrowed library books back to school. There are still a few that we are missing so please take some time over the weekend to have a look and bring in any that you find on Monday.

I would like to thank those of you who have supported your child with reading practise at home this past year. This support has been the highest level we have ever had, with the most number reading awards handed out. It is no coincidence that the data for reading attainment across the whole school has also improved, with 86% of children in Year 6 achieving at least the expected level in reading (nationally this figure was 74%).

We will launch the reading awards again in September, and hope that we continue to build on the successes of this year with your support.

Uniform

We are hopeful that any unclaimed items of clothing will be reunited with their owners by the end of the school year. In each classroom is a basket with a few items in where we have not been able to identify who they belong to. If your child is missing any uniform, please ask them to check these baskets to see if it is in there. Any items that are left unclaimed at the end of the year will be washed and put in our pre-loved uniform stock.

If you are wanting to order new uniform for September from our supplier, PL Schoolwear, it is advisable to do so as early as possible to ensure you receive it in time for the new term. They do get very busy during the summer break. We do have several samples of uniform in school for your child to try if you are unsure about what size you need. 




