Dear Parents and Carers,

It is hard to believe that the beginning of the week was so wet and soggy when looking outside at the sunshine this afternoon. The weather seems so changeable at the moment so please can you make sure your child comes to school each day with a coat. Even if the weather is drizzly, we try to get outside as often as possible at break and lunchtimes.

PARKING

Parking at drop off and pick up times is an ongoing concern and there are a few things we can all do to help keep the areas outside of school be as safe as possible during these busy times of the day. We urge you to **please not park in the direct vicinity of the school.** Areas of particular concern are the parking on the bend of School Lane turning into Church Street and outside of Lime Tree Court, which has two driveways that must be kept clear at all times for emergency and medical services. We also request that parents **do not use the school staff car park** when dropping off and picking up from wrap-around care and clubs.

For the safety of all our children, it is much safer to park away from the school either at the top end of Main Street, on Portway Road or by the Rec and walk along the narrow section of road in Main Street/Church Street. The fewer cars parked in the vicinity of the school, the safer it will be for everyone. This will also ensure our school neighbours maintain their access to their properties.

Thank you to those parents who do show consideration and park away from the school and we appreciate your support.

YEAR 5 BIKEABILITY



Over this past week, Year 5 were out and about on their bikes completing the Level 2 Bikeability course; an important aspect of our curriculum in teaching children how to be safe. The children taking part demonstrated their skills and knowledge when using a bike, learnt how to complete safety checks and ride safely on the roads. I am so proud of the feedback we received from the Bikeability trainers who were full of praise for how polite the children were and good at listening to and following their instructions.



Penalty Notices for School Attendance

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notice, the following will come with force for absences that starr after 19th August 2024. This is nationwise and across binders if you move school or house. Term Time Leave is only allowed in exceptional circumstances when communicated in odvance with evidence provided as soon as possible to the Hoofteacher.

FIRST OFFENCE

The first Penalty Notice issued for To Time Leave of Absence or Irregula Attendation, the amount of the Fire is \$160 per parent, per child if paid with days and reduced to 150 per parent, while if paid with 21 days

SECOND OFFENCE

PLEASE ENSURE YOU COMMUNICATE WITH YOUR CHILD'S SCHOOL

In law only the headbeacher of a school can authorise a child's slotence. A pupil's attendance forms part of their official inhool record.

Parents do not have an automotic right to remove their child from school during term time for the purpose of a leave of ebsence and are strongly advised not to do so.
