Penalty Notices for School Attendance

With the attroduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following will come into force for absences that start after 39th August 2024. This is netromwise and across borders if you move school or house. Term Time Leave is unity allowed in exceptional circumstances when communicated in advance with evidence provided as soon as possible to the Headheacher.

FIRST OFFENCE

The first Penalty Notice issued for Earn Time Leave of Absence or Irregular Attendance, the amount of the fine will be £100 per parent, per child if pald within 28 days and refuced to £00 per parent, per child if juid with 71 days

SECOND OFFENCE

For the second Penalty Notice (within three years of the first offence) issued for Term Time Leaves of Alexence or Irregular Altecolance, the amount of the fine-will be £180 per jament, per child if paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered.

PLEASE ENSURE YOU COMMUNICATE WITH YOUR CHILD'S SCHOOL in law only the headleacher of a school can authorise a child's absence. A pupil's attendance forms part of their official school record.

Parents do not have an automatic right to remove their child from school during term time for the purpose of a leave of absence and are strongly advised not to do to

Headteachers are unable to authorise leave of absence during term time unless they are satisfied that there are exceptional circumstances.

The fundamental principles for defining 'exceptional' are rare, significant, unavoidable and short. 'Unavoidable' implies that an event could not reasonably be scheduled at another time.

10 sessions in 10 week

Penalty Notices will be considered for any 10 sessions of unauthorized absence in 16 weeks.

5 consecutive days of term time absence can trigger a Penalty Notice.

Do not forget that Penalty Notices are sound Per Parent. Per Child. i.e. Two ublings storent would result in each parent receiving 2 fines. This could amount to FMD.



Starting school for the first time

Was your child born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021?

If yes, Buckinghamshire parents can apply online for a school place from 5 November 2024. Visit buckinghamshire gov.uk/schools-and-learning/schools-index/school-admissions to apply.

You must apply even if your child is at the nursery attached to the school you would like them to go to.

Information about starting school for the first time will be available on our website from the end of October bucklinghamshire.gov.uk/schools and-learning ischools-index/school-admissions.

The application deadline is 15 January 2025, please do not miss it
